SUMMONS

Summons for the Two Hundred and Twenty Ninth Session of the Rajya Sabha was issued to the Members on the 19th July, 2013.

DURATION OF THE SESSION

The Two Hundred and Twenty Ninth Session of the Rajya Sabha commenced on the 5th August, 2013. The sitting of the House, which was earlier scheduled to adjourn on 30th August, 2013 was extended initially by five days, *i.e.*, from 2nd to 6th September, 2013 and subsequently by one day, *i.e.*, for 7th September, 2013, on the recommendations of the Business Advisory Committee. The sittings of the House fixed for 16th, 21st and 24th August, 2013 were cancelled. The announcement regarding cancellation/extension of the sittings were made in the House on the 12th, 23rd and 27th August, 2013 and 6th September, 2013. The House was adjourned *sine die* on the 7th September, 2013. The House sat for 21 days and the actual hours of sittings were 99 hours and 14 minutes (excluding recess intervals). The House was prorogued by the President on the 10th September, 2013.
