PRIVATE MEMBERS' LEGISLATIVE BUSINESS

Bills for introduction

1. SHRI RAJKUMAR DHOOT to move for leave to introduce a Bill to provide for the compulsory protection of witnesses and victims of crimes by the State who are intimidated, harassed, physically attacked by various means or of their family members or their near and dear ones by the accused of crimes or by their accomplices or friends or relatives or co-accused or sympathizers committed either directly against the victims or against their family members or their near and dear ones and for matters connected therewith and incidental thereto. *The Compulsory Protection of Witnesses and Victims of Crimes Bill, 2017.*

ALSO to introduce the Bill.

The Heritage Cities and Sites (Conservation and Development) Bill, 2017.

2. SHRI RAJKUMAR DHOOT to move for leave to introduce a Bill to provide for the conservation and development of heritage cities and sites by way of retaining their historical identification and promoting international and domestic tourism and publishing their historical importance through booklets, pamphlets and such other material and for declaring heritage cities as smart cities for overall development and for matters connected therewith and incidental thereto.

ALSO to introduce the Bill.

The Environment Protection (Management of Landfill Sites and Control of Non-Biodegradable Garbage) Bill, 2017.

3. SHRI RAJKUMAR DHOOT to move for leave to introduce a Bill to provide for the formulation of a national policy to set up engineered landfill sites at conspicuous places away from human settlements, for their scientific management and for preparing a model solid waste management policy to prevent throwing or depositing non-biodegradable garbage or waste at public places such as roads, parks, public drains or places open to public view so as to protect the environment and ultimately mother earth from being polluted by such garbage or waste responsible for the climate change and for matters connected therewith and incidental thereto.

ALSO to introduce the Bill.

The Education (Inclusive Development and Regulation) Bill, 2018.

4. SHRI VIVEK GUPTA to move for leave to introduce a Bill to establish an Authority for inclusive development and regulation of education to provide for inclusion of traditional Indian knowledge, ancient Indian history, culture, civics, digital and financial education in the education curriculum, increase in their weightage in the syllabus, institution of compulsory qualifying paper, creating fund for promoting research on theories postulated in ancient texts, issuing guidelines to the Central and State Governments to make the education more inclusive, recommending to the Central Government for free and compulsory education at secondary and senior secondary level, formulating recommendations to the Central and State Governments for regulating fees in educational institutions and for matters connected therewith and incidental thereto.

ALSO to introduce the Bill.

The Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises Development (Amendment) Bill, 2018.

5. DR. T. SUBBARAMI REDDY to move for leave to introduce a Bill to amend the Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises Development Act, 2006.

The Constitution (Amendment) Bill, 2018 (insertion of new articles 330A, 332A, etc.).

6. SHRI V. VIJAYASAI REDDY to move for leave to introduce a Bill further to amend the Constitution of India.

ALSO to introduce the Bill.

The Constitution (Amendment) Bill, 2018 (amendment of articles 15 and 16).

7. SHRI V. VIJAYASAI REDDY to move for leave to introduce a Bill further to amend the Constitution of India.

ALSO to introduce the Bill.

Bills for consideration and passing

8. DR. SUBRAMANIAN SWAMY to move that the Bill to create an Authority to ensure stabilization of population of cows (*Bos Indicus*) and to suggest such measures to comply with articles 37 and 48 of the Constitution, to ban the slaughter of cows and to provide for deterrent punishment including death penalty for slaughter of cows and for matters connected therewith or incidental thereto, be taken into consideration. **The Cow Protection Bill, 2017.*

ALSO to move that the Bill be passed.

9. SHRI SUKHENDU SEKHAR RAY to move that the Bill further to amend the Constitution of India, be taken into consideration. *The Constitution (Amendment) Bill, 2017 (amendment of article 366).*

ALSO to move that the Bill be passed.

10. SHRI PRADEEP TAMTA to move that the Bill to provide for abolition of capital punishment in India, be taken into consideration. *The Abolition of Capital Punishment Bill, 2016.*

ALSO to move that the Bill be passed.

11. SHRI B. K. HARIPRASAD to move that the Bill further to amend the Constitution of India, be taken into consideration. *The Constitution (Amendment) Bill, 2016 (insertion of new article 338B).*

ALSO to move that the Bill be passed.

12. SHRI RAJEEV CHANDRASEKHAR to move that the Bill to enshrine in law a covenant prescribing a commitment between the people of India and the Armed Forces Community, serving as well as retired and their immediate families pledging a duty of care and improving support towards them in return for their bravery and sacrifices made for protecting the nation and to ensure that they face no disadvantage compared to other citizens in the provision of public and commercial services and for matters connected therewith or incidental thereto, be taken into consideration. *The Armed Forces Covenant Bill, 2012.*
